

SEE MORE PERSPECTIVE is an MC, Producer/ Composer, Spoken Word Poet, Visual Artist, Filmmaker, and Educator. Their work explores identity, culture, social justice, mythology, science fiction, spirituality, and the paranormal. See More has received the VERVE grant for spoken word for a spoken word album about dreams, freedom fighters and mythology; the Artist Initiative grant from the MN State Arts Board for a music video suite about healthy sexuality, sex positivity, consent, and rape culture; and a Cedar Commission from the Cedar Cultural Center to premiere new work about new mythologies and cultural justice work. As a member of the Night Light cohort grant project from Public Arts Saint Paul, See More created a 3D digital projection-mapping installation in 2021 to premiere 'Jaws of Life After Death', a psychedelic Death trip of hip hop, poetry, synth, and soaring ethereal vocals. He is currently helping Teatro de Pueblo develop a cultural adaptation of 'Romeo and Juliet', writing rap and spoken word for a new character that kicks the Chorus off stage. They are also producing Kat Parent's powerful upcoming album 'Swampling', which premiered at the Cedar Cultural Center at the

top of 2022. His most recent release, 'Edgar Allen Poe Dameron', is an action packed boom bap tour de force of MCing and Beat-making. Learn more at www.seemoreperspective.com

Conductor and violinist Marco Real-d'Arbelles is gaining a reputation for service and community building through music garnering multiple awards including the Conducting Prize for his work with the Chamber Philharmonic of Catalunya (Spain), Special Recognition by the City of Doral (Florida) for contributions to the arts and his work with youth, and is a grant recipient of the Metropolitan Regional Arts Council and the Minnesota State Arts Board. Marco is currently Associate Artistic Director of the Bach Society of Minnesota, Music Director of Opera on the Lake and Bold North Baroque Opera. Previous conducting positions include Winter Opera St. Louis, Chicago Summer Opera, Miami Classical Music Festival, Oberlin in Italy, and The Miami Symphony Orchestra. Born in Nicaragua and raised in Miami, Marco began studying violin at the age of 11. He is currently based in Minneapolis.

American soprano **Elena Stabile** is a dynamic performer of operatic and contemporary art music and a teacher of both voice and piano. She is currently pursuing her doctorate at the University of Minnesota, under the tutelage of John De Haan, and sings regularly with Twin Cities area churches and organizations. She is also a founding member of Strange Trace, a young opera company dedicated to the production and performance of new compositions that seek to holistically redefine the experience of opera. Recent projects include Eugene Onegin (Tatyana) with Skylark Opera and the collegiate premiere of Hometown to the World (Linda Larsen) with the UMN University Opera Theater. She is also a three year Performance Fellow with the Nief Norf Summer Festival in Knoxville, TN.

Kat Parent is a Twin Cities singer/songwriter who trained with the Seattle Girl's Choir and St. Olaf Choir. In 2022, Kat wrote and performed the original song cycle Swampling at the Cedar Cultural Center as a Cedar Commission artist. They've performed with folk musician Sarah Larsson as The Lacewings and with hiphop artist SEE MORE PERSPECTIVE as Skyspiders and the Imperceptible Web. Their 2017 debut album, The Wait for Green, is currently featured through Hennepin County Library's MNSpin program.

Lutenist Phillip Rukavina performs as a lute and vihuela soloist and as a continuo lutenist. He has appeared at many major festivals specializing in early music, including the Utrecht Early Music Festival (2013) and the Boston Early Music Festival (2015). In 2017, Phillip was invited to perform as a soloist at the European Lute Festival in Füssen, Germany and at the Lute Society of America's WestFest, held in Victoria, BC Canada. Phillip is a founding member of the Venere Lute Quartet and has performed with many prominent ensembles, including the **Newberry** Consort, the Texas Early Music Project, the Rose Ensemble, the Bach Society MN and with renowned sopranos Emma Kirkby and **Ellen Hargis**. He has served on the faculty of the Lute Society of America's LuteFest in Cleveland, OH and the Amherst and Vancouver Early Music Festivals. She has performed on three continents. In the summer of 2019, a recital and masterclass tour in China with soprano Han Ge took her to Chongging, Wuhan, Changsha, and Chengdu. She is a frequent performer at Shanghai Concert Hall's Afternoon Tea Concert Series, including a sold-out performance of Schubert's Winterreise, marking the organization's 1,400th special event. She has also performed at the Franz-Schubert-Institute in Austria, Oberlin in Italy, and Hot Springs Music Festival. Dr. Liu received her Doctorate in Musical Arts in Collaborative Piano from the University of Minnesota, Twin Cities under the guidance of Dr. Timothy Lovelace. She holds degrees from Shanghai Normal University, Lynn Conservatory of Music, and University of Tennessee-Knoxville.
