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Biographies

Australian-born tenor **Matthew Shorten** is lauded for his "lovely touch" (Star Tribune) and "marvelous singing" (Pioneer Press). Matthew is a multifaceted musician with specialties in early music, oratorio, opera, and choral music of the Renaissance, Baroque, and Classical periods. He performs with ensembles internationally, and recently spent the 2022-23 season with acclaimed ensemble Cantus. Matthew received his B.Mus. summa cum laude from Vanderbilt University, and is an M.A. Candidate at the Williams College Graduate Program in the History of Art.

Two-time JUNO Award winning conductor, composer, recorder, and flute soloist Matthias Maute has achieved an international reputation. In 2016 he was named artistic director of the Bach Society of Minnesota and in 2019 of the professional choir Ensemble vocal Arts-Québec. Impressed by his artistic approach, The New York Times described the orchestra he conducts in Montreal, Ensemble Caprice, as being "an ensemble that encourages the listener to rehear the world." Maute's recording of Bach's Brandenburg Concertos juxtaposed with Maute's own arrangements of Preludes from Shostakovich's Op. 87 was hailed by The New Yorker's Alex Ross as standing out "for its fleet, characterful approach" and "its fresh, vibrant colors". Matthias Maute's compositions are published by Breitkopf & Härtel, Amadeus, Moeck and Carus. Maute's 1 st violin concerto was performed by soloist Mark Fewer with the St. John's Symphony and with l Musici de Montréal. Matthias Maute has made some twenty recordings on the Analekta, Vanguard Classics, Bella Musica, Dorian, Bridge and ATMA Classique labels.

Brazilian recorder player **Cléa Galhano** is an internationally renowned performer of early, contemporary, and Brazilian music. Galhano has performed in the United States, Canada, South America and Europe as a chamber musician, collaborating with recorder player Marion Verbruggen, Jacques Ogg, Belladonna Baroque Quartet and Kingsbury Ensemble. As a featured soloist, Galhano has worked with the Saint Paul Chamber Orchestra, New World Symphony, Musical Offering and Lyra Baroque Orchestra. Galhano studied in Brazil at Faculdade Santa Marcelina, the Royal Conservatory (The Hague), and the New England Conservatory of Music in Boston, as a Fulbright Scholar. She is the Music Director of the Recorder Orchestra of the Midwest. Ms. Galhano recently received the prestigious McKnight fellowship award, MSAB Cultural collaborative and MSAB Arts Initiative. Currently, she is a faculty member at Macalester College and Adjunct Lecturer in Music, Recorder at HPI, Jacobs School of Music, IU.

Violinist Margaret Humphrey maintains a vibrant freelance schedule as a soloist, chamber musician, and orchestra member, performing in ensembles in the US and Europe. She performs regularly with the Lyra Baroque Orchestra, Tempesta di Mare, and as concertmaster of the Bach Society of MN. A founding member of Belladonna Baroque quartet, she has toured throughout the US, Europe, and Brazil. Cerulean Fire, her most recent ensemble, collaborates with dancers and percussionists crossing over genres to create dynamic performance experiences. Ms. Humphrey is also a member of the Kingsbury Ensemble in St. Louis as well as soloing yearly in the Ancient Music Series in Saint-Savin, France, She has recorded on the Chandos, Dorian, Ten Thousand Lakes, and Naxos labels.

Bach Society of Minnesota was founded in 1932, one of the first organizations in North America to take the legacy of Johann Sebastian Bach as an exclusive starting point for world-class performances with period instruments and historic performance practices that evoke the depths and passions of Bach's compositions. Under the artistic direction of Matthias Maute, the organization continues its focus on collaboration and excellence, striving to create respectful, successful relationships among musicians, audiences, students, and partner organizations, and building a diverse community with a shared passion for performing, promoting, and appreciating the music of J.S. 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
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
